"Professor Hughes retells four crucial myths, those of Narcissus, Orpheus, Dionysos, and the Christ of St. Matthew's gospel. He then considers their expression in the work of several 19th and 20th century authors, including Hawthorne, Conrad, D. H. Lawrence, Agatha Christie, James Dickey, Kurt Vonnegut, Richard Brautigan, and Flannery O'Connor."
