It shows "how the novel tradition in the Arab world has grown to maturity in little more than two or three generations. The novels analysed ... show many penetrating insights into aspects of contemporary Arab society ..."

Berne, Stanley. The Great American Empire. New York: Horizon Press, 1982. Pp. 194. \$9.95. "... a novel which is innovative and yet highly readable ... [it] demands a careful reading and clearly deserves it."

Cowasjee, Saros, ed. Stories from the Raj: From Kipling to Independence. London: The Bodley Head, 1982. Pp. 272. \$19.95. Masters, Olga. The Home Girls. St. Lucia: Univ. of Queensland Press, 1982. Pp. 194. \$8.50. "Many of the [twenty] stories are set in the small-town Australia of the Depression, and Masters treats rural poverty and conflict in an intensely personal, sympathetic way."

Mellick, J.S.D., ed. Henry Kingsley. St. Lucia: Univ. of Queensland Press, 1982. Pp. 606. \$30.00. "This volume contains a facsimile of the 1877 edition of Henry Kingsley's The Recollections of Geoffry Hamlyn, widely regarded as one of the foundation novels in Australian literary history." It also contains extracts from other novels, short fiction, articles, and a selection of criticism.

Moorsom, Sasha. In the Shadow of the Paradise Tree. London: Routledge & Kegan Paul, 1983. Pp. 247. \$22.75. This "dramatic story unfolds with an intriguing blend of the satirical and the serious. It reflects the conflicts that beset so many ex-colonial territories and outsiders' clumsy attempts to resolve them."


