AUTHORITATIVE STUDIES IN WORLD LITERATURE

Guidelines

- Each study deals with the life, work, and criticism of one author, and consists of five chapters:
- CHAPTER I. Biographical information, i.e., complete name of author; dates and places of birth and death; names of father and mother; any relevant information regarding the author's ancestry; names of sisters and brothers; schooling; special apprenticeships; jobs held; travels; first attempts at writing; first publications (readings or performances); first critical evaluation of the author's writings; love affairs; marriages (with names and dates); children; extramarital relationships, special friendships; emotional or philosophical crises; political, religious, scholarly, or professional affiliations; social activities; special personalities or incidents that affected the author; any other pertinent information.
- CHAPTER II. A list of the author's works (with English translation of all non-English titles), with place of first publication, name of publisher, exact date of publication (or first performance), and number of pages of each work. If the date of writing a work differs considerably from the date of its first publication (or first performance), both dates should be included. A list of collected works and special editions should also be included. If author is a non-English writer, a short list of "Selected Titles Available in English Translation" should be supplied.
- CHAPTER III. A summary of the author's most important works (plot outline, recurring themes, leitmotifs, abstract ideas, etc.).
- CHAPTER IV. An evaluation of the author's works, and a condensation of other opinions.
- CHAPTER V. An alphabetically arranged bibliography of the major publications that deal with the author, with number of pages of each work, and an assessment of each of them. This list may be divided into subsections (e.g., Bibliographies; Biographies; General Studies; Style; Individual Works), each of which is alphabetically arranged.
- Individual chapters may vary in length as long as the total number of pages remains between 55 and 60 double-spaced, 25-line pages (approx. 17,000 words). There will be no other sections or subsections beside these five chapters, i.e., no foreword, preface, introduction, prologue, epilogue, supplement, or any kind of addenda; and there will be no epigraphs, acknowledgments, or dedications.
- Footnotes should be avoided. However, complete bibliographical information regarding all quotations should appear, in parentheses, immediately after each quoted text. All non-English quotations should be translated into English. Longer quotations (100 words or more) from other works--also from those written by the author of the study--should not be used in the new text.
- Three fair copies of the MS should be made; two copies to be used by York Press, and one copy remains with the author for proofreading. Proofs should be read by the author and one other person. Spelling, hyphenation, and capitalization are according to Webster's. Additional information regarding the writing and typing of the study is to be found in The York Press Style Manual.

GUIDELINES

Manuscripts are accepted in English and should be prepared, with complete endnotes, in conformity with the second and revised edition of the *York Press Style Manual* (available from York Press, Box 1172, Fredericton, N.B., Canada E3B 5C8, at a cost of \$2.50). Although the *York Press Style Manual* has adopted all new changes included in the *MLA Style Manual*, the *IFR* still uses footnotes with no List of Works Cited.

Following are some additional points to which we should like to draw your attention:

Book reviews are 2-3 typewritten pages; approximately 500-750 words (with no footnotes). Articles and Short Essays are 5-15 typewritten pages; approximately 1500-4500 words.

Spelling, capitalization, and hyphenation are according to Webster.

Quotations should be kept at a minimum. No prose quotations longer than 100 words. No verse quotations longer than two lines. All quotations should be incorporated into the text. All non-English quotations must be translated into English; translators of texts and quotations must be identified.

Footnotes are reserved for bibliographical information (comments and explanations are to be incorporated into the text or dropped altogether). All footnotes should be typed together on one sheet in the form of endnotes.

Frequent references to a specific work should appear in the text and not as a footnote (see *York Press Style Manual 8*). Footnotes that refer to a previously mentioned or quoted work should include the author's name, or the author's name and the abbreviated title of the work instead of ibid., loc. cit., or op. cit.

Only titles of books, periodicals, and uncommon foreign words (i.e., words that do not appear in *Webster's Collegiate Dictionary*) should be underlined. Words under discussion, questionable terms, and new coinages should be placed between double quotation marks.
