Mordechai Abir, who was last year a visiting professor at York University, Toronto, lectures at the Institute of Asian and African Studies, Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He is joint-author of *In the Direction of the Persian Gulf: the Soviet Union and the Persian Gulf* (1977) and has written many articles on international affairs.

David Charters is Deputy Director of the Centre for Conflict Studies.
