Dr. Martin Blumenson served as an official historian with the U. S. Army during and after the Second World War. He is the author or editor of more than a dozen books in the field of military history, among them *The Patton Papers* and, most recently, a biography of General Mark Clark. He lectures widely to military and academic audiences.

Glenn P. Hastedt is Assistant Professor of Political Science at James Madison University in Virginia. He received a Ph. D. from Indiana University, and has published widely on the study of American intelligence matters.
