NOTES RESPECTING REVOLUTIONARY ORGANIZATIONS

AND AGITATORS IN CANADA.

REPORT

The O.B.U. agitation in Cape Breton seems to be checked, partly by the prowess of Malcolm Bruce, partly by the threatened deportation of Legere. If Legere is put out of the country the agitation may die, unless R. B. Russell proves effective.

The Communist Party in Winnipeg is seriously weakened by recurring quarrels between the English and Jewish elements. It may settle down into two more or less obscure factions, Ukrainian and English.

H.M. Bartholomew is encountering discouragements in his candidacy in Edmonton. His relations with the Canadian Labour Party are deeply tainted with insincerity, and he is in effect the candidate of the virulently discontented foreigners.

The film "Polikuska" was performed in Toronto, the theatre being filled by an audience, nine-tenths of whom were Jews. It apparently is interesting, and it received a favourable notice in the Toronto Globe.
