Reading Service for Writers

If you are a new writer, or a writer with a challenging or troublesome manuscript, *Event's* Reading Service for Writers may be just what you need.

Every year *Event* receives hundreds of manuscripts. Many are good, but since we can't publish them all, we send many of them back, sometimes with a brief note, sometimes with only a stock reject form. Now we have an option for the writer who wants more from us.

You can now receive a commentary on your manuscript from *Event's* editors. Your manuscript will receive an assessment of 700–1000 words, focusing on the strengths and weaknesses of the writing with attention to such aspects of craft as voice, structure, point of view, characterization, etc. That way you'll see how one group of experienced editors reads your work.

Eligible manuscripts include poetry (up to eight poems), and short fiction and creative non-fiction under 5,000 words. All manuscripts read by *Event's* Reading Service for Writers are, of course, considered for publication. You should receive the commentary in about four to eight weeks.

Event's Reading Service for Writers costs a nominal fee: include with each submission a cheque or money order for \$100, payable to *Event* (includes GST, if applicable; US and overseas residents, please pay in US\$). You'll also receive a one-year subscription (or renewal)—worth \$24.95—with the reading fee so you can check out *Event's* award-winning mix of poetry, fiction, creative non-fiction, reviews and notes on writing.

One Poetry Entry is up to 3 poems with no more than 100 lines per poem.

Entry Fee \$30 (CAD) for Canadian entries and \$36 (US) for U.S. and overseas entries. The entry fee includes a one-year subscription to *The Fiddlehead*. Multiple submissions are allowed but only your first entry in each category will be eligible for a subscription.
