#### **Details of Journal**

Antistasis: An Open Educational Journal is a semi-annual publication. It constitutes an attempt to curate a public discussion about education envisaged, in its broadest sense, as a public good. Each issue engages a compelling theme, approaching it with short articles written for a public audience. The audience for this journal includes, but not be limited to, academics, graduate students, teacher candidates, educators, and administrators. Authors should assume that the audience is not familiar with the theory, jargon, or literature that characterizes distinct fields of academic writing. The principal aim of this journal publication is to cultivate a forum for the discussion and dissemination of educational ideas, research, and developments to the general public, not only to academics. Antistasis is indexed in and available through EBSCOHOST and ProQuest.

#### Focus of Special Issue: Educational Leadership: Complexities and Practicalities

This call for papers invites submissions on the theme: "Educational Leadership: Complexities and Practicalities." During the past decade, educational leadership has been affected by dynamic changes. Such changes include financial restraints, an increased focus on standardized data, a greater need for teacher leadership, a greater need for cultural leadership, a greater focus on parent and community involvement, and the explosion of technology, to name of few. In turn, the new roles and responsibilities of principals, vice-principals, department heads, and teachers are making work-life balance, at best, difficult to achieve. The focus of this special issue not only addresses the increasing complexity of educational leadership, but also provides practical suggestions for meeting these challenges.

### **Submissions**

For this issue, each submission will be peer-reviewed by at least two academic referees. Submissions should be between 1,000 and 1,500 words including references (no abstract is necessary). Citations and references must be consistent with the America Psychological Association, 6th ed. (see http://www.apastyle.org/).
