# The International Hydrographic Review

Instructions for contributors

The International Hydrographic Review is an international journal publishing original works on all aspects of hydrography and associated subjects, ranging from the latest technical developments to history. It also provides a medium for discussions in the form of shorter articles and notes.

Submissions should be sent to:
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ARTICLES should be 4,000-6,000 words long, although longer articles may be considered. Authors are responsible for ensuring that all manuscripts are accurately typed before final submission. Contributions are normally received with the understanding that they comprise original, unpublished material and are not being submitted for publication elsewhere. All articles will be refereed by at least two persons, to ensure both accuracy and relevance and amendments to the script may be required before final acceptance. On acceptance contributions are subject to editorial amendment. Authors will receive a proof copy of the final article before publication. Reasonable amendments may be made by the author at that time.

**NOTES** of approximately 1,500-2,500 words may be accepted if the subject does not lend itself to a full article. These will not be refereed but will be subject to editorial comment and amendments.

**MEETING REPORTS.** When appropriate the Review may contain reports of relevant meetings.

BOOK REVIEWS should normally be approximately 1,000 words in length.

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- Short title (up to 40 characters including spaces), subtitle (if desired), author(s)' name(s) and affiliation(s).
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Bibliographical references should be listed at the end of the articles in the standard Harvard form. Footnotes should be kept

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
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
