

SOUNDINGS IN THE NORTH ATLANTIC OCEAN

(Corrections to Sheet A₁ of the General Bathymetric Chart of the Oceans, 3rd Edition, April, 1935).

The German vessels *Karlsruhe* and *Columbus* and the French vessel *Flandre* have recorded series of sonic soundings taken in certain portions of the North Atlantic Ocean.

These soundings have been communicated to the I. H. B. by the Chiefs of the Hydrographic Services to which these vessels belong.

The German soundings have been reproduced in the *Beiheft zu den Nachrichten für Seefahrer, Heft 19/1936*.

Some of these deep sea soundings complete or modify certain details shown on the Edition of April 1935 of Sheet A₁ of the General Bathymetric Chart of the Oceans.

The information transmitted to date to the I. H. B. by the Chiefs of the Spanish and French Hydrographic Services have led to certain modifications in the bathymetry of the western portion of the Mediterranean in the vicinity of the Straits of Gibraltar.

All of these modifications are given, on the scale of the General Bathymetric Chart of the Oceans, in the accompanying sketches.
