TECHNICAL QUESTIONS SUBMITTED TO THE THIRD INTERNATIONAL HYDROGRAPHIC CONFERENCE

APRIL, 1932.

The International Hydrographic Bureau has prepared a pamphlet containing the Proposals Made by the States Members and by the Directing Committee of the International Hydrographic Bureau to be discussed at the Third International Hydrographic Conference held at Monaco in April, 1932. The technical proposals made are briefly summarised hereunder; for more ample details readers are referred to the Report of Proceedings of the Third International Hydrographic Conference, which will shortly be published by the International Hydrographic Bureau.

CHARTS

Numbering of Charts: A number in Arabic numerals should be assigned to each chart. Conditions in which the words "New Issue", "Edition", "New Edition", "Reprint", etc., should be used.

Danger the existence or the position of which is doubtful: The abbreviations E.D. or P.D. should always be inserted against such dangers.

Abbreviations for Radiotelegraphic Stations: It is proposed to adopt the following abbreviations:

RG = Direction-finding station; RD = Directional (or directed)

RC = Circular radio-beacon;

radio-beacon:

RW = Rotating radio-beacon.

Submarine Sound Signal: Symbol.

Quays and Jetties: Method of representing.

Insertion of Soundings on Charts: On charts where soundings are expressed in metres, the decimetre figures (other than zero) should be inscribed for depths of less than 15 metres, wherever the scale of the chart enables this to be done.

Position of Depth Contours on Charts: Depth Contours should be drawn on charts in such a way that no sounding-figure having exactly the same value as a contour line should be inserted outside that line.

Depth Contours: Conventions.

Limits of Ports and Roadsteads: General Symbol for Limits.

References to Charts: The reference should be made not only by means of the chart number but should include also the date (year and month) of the edition.

Publication of Lists of Oceanic Soundings: Form of publication.

Colour to be added over the signs of Airway Lights and Radio Aids to Navigation as used on charts.
