MR. E. ALLISON MACKAY

Mr. E. Allison MacKay, a prominent lawyer in Fredericton and well known throughout New Brunswick, died at his residence on January 16, 1948. He was admitted to the New Brunswick Bar in 1917 after graduating from the University of New Brunswick after reading law with the firm of Gregory and Winslow in Fredericton.

Mr. MacKay was prominent in government, legal, fraternal and sports circles throughout the province. He was Clerk of the New Brunswick Legislature for the past eleven years and as a government official he was courteous, able and hard-working. He did much to bring legislative procedure up-to-date, and was identified with the revision of many outmoded statutes.

He was also the chairman of the New Brunswick Civil Service Commission and in that role showed himself to be impartial and fair. He was secretary of the New Brunswick Barristers' Association and held the liking and respect of all members of the legal profession.

Mr. MacKay was also secretary of the Fredericton Golf Club, and belonged to the Masonic Order, the Fredericton Rotary Club and the Fredericton Curling Club. His circle of friends and acquaintances was unusually large, and this kindly, capable, pleasant man will be greatly missed.
